

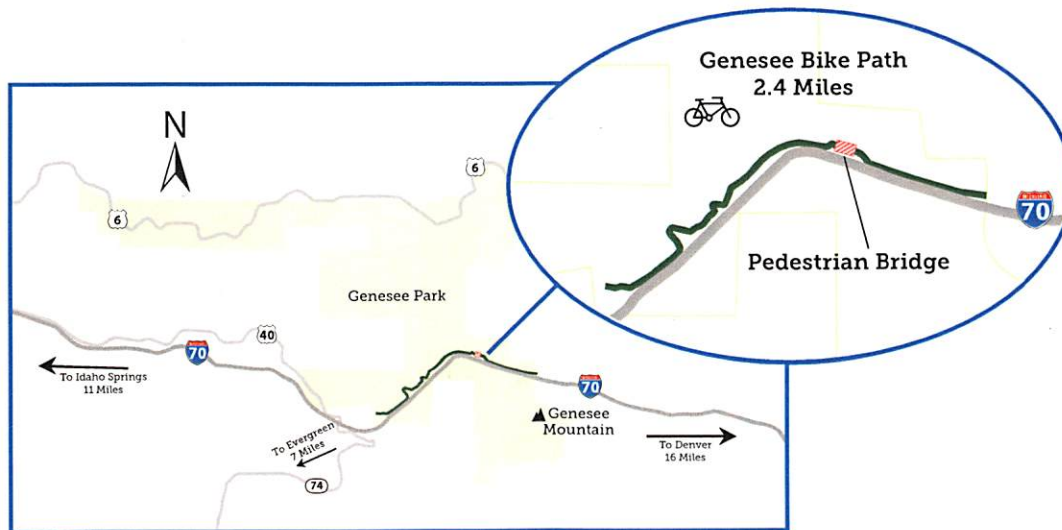

QUARTERLY UPDATE

I-70 BIKE PATH & PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE—GENESEE



OVERVIEW

Construction continues on the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) project to construct a new 2.4-mile concrete, multipurpose trail and a 120-foot long pedestrian bridge on the north side of Interstate 70 between Mile Points (MP) 251.4 and 253.8 in Genesee Park. Most of the trail will be on land owned by the City and County of Denver, starting just west of the Genesee exit, near the buffalo pasture.

Currently, cyclists ride on the shoulders of I-70 to get from the Genesee exit to the El Rancho exit. This project will complete the trail that currently extends along I-70, giving bicyclists a safer route to travel through the foothills of the Rocky Mountains.

UPDATE

Crews are currently installing barrier along I-70. Fencing operations are complete, and will ensure protection of the bison and buffalo herd, enclosing them in the pasture on the north side of I-70. Electrical work and relocation of light poles have also been completed. Upcoming work includes pouring the concrete bridge abutments at Mt. Vernon, and paving of the new bike path. Plan revisions have been completed and project schedule has been extended with an anticipated completion early summer of 2016.

SCHEDULE AND TRAFFIC IMPACTS

Normal working hours are Monday through Friday, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Shoulder closures may be in place along I-70 to protect crews working along the highway.
